1. Call to Order / Introductions/ Review Agenda -

Chairman Mike Quilty, called the meeting to order at p.m. Committee began with introductions.

2. Review / Approve Minutes -

The Chairman asked if there were any additions or corrections to the July meeting minutes.

On a motion by Jim Lewis, seconded by Bruce Sophie, the minutes were unanimously approved as presented.

3. Public Comment -

Public Hearing #1:

4. 2015-18 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) & 2013-38 Regional Plan Amendment

The Chair read the public hearing procedure.

Ryan MacLaren gave an overview of the proposed amendment:

• The Interstate 5: Barnett Road Overpass Bridge has been deemed structurally deficient due to a "Poor" rating for the deck. There are numerous deficiencies in the deck surface, and the proposed overlay will preserve the bridge. State and ODOT funds (\$759,600) will be used. The TAC has recommended approval of the amendment.

The Chair opened public testimony.

In support: Mike Montero expressed support for the amendment.

In opposition: None received

The Chair closed the public hearing.

On a motion by Jim Lewis, seconded by Bruce Sophie, the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) & Regional Plan Amendment for the Barnett Overpass overlay was unanimously approved by voice vote.

Action Item:

5. MPO Letter of Support / Medford Urban Growth Areas

Dick Converse gave an overview of the general concept letter on Medford's complete Future Growth Areas. The City will be providing future details on each, individual area as UGB inclusions move forward.

Mike Quilty asked about locational details on (alternative) arterials to Interstate 5 (Foothill/N. Phoenix and the Westside connections). Mr. Converse said that more details will be forthcoming, but that those issues were more a part of the TSP.

Alex Georgevitch stated that most connectivity would be internal for Medford, thereby not affecting connections to other jurisdictions. He also passed out an updated Conceptual Plan of the Urban Reserve, and pointed out that there were many other levels of detail and review, including additional transportation analysis at the TSP and master planning levels, before any future development can be approved.

Members briefly discussed other aspects of both current and future roadway connections.

Josh LeBombard reminded everyone that the current process is related exclusively to the RPS **Conceptual Plans**. Mike Montero reiterated that the RPS goal was to assure that the regional growth would occur in a fashion that would address future transportation connectivity needs appropriately.

On a motion by Jim Lewis, seconded by Bruce Sophie, the Policy Committee Chairman was authorized to sign the concept review letter, as amended to correct typographic errors, for the City if Medford, in compliance with Regional Plan Performance Indicators 2.7 and 2.8. The motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

6. MPO Dues Request - \$500 to Support Livability Solutions Forum (Economy, Housing, Transportation)

Dan Moore presented a request for a \$500 contribution (from dues funds) to support the Livability Solutions Forum. The majority of the TAC has recommended that the Policy Committee use \$400 from 5303 funds, with a \$100 match from dues.

Paige Townsend, RVTD, passed out a flyer about the Forum. Transportation will be a significant focus of the entire Forum.

On a motion by Mike Baker, seconded by Jim Lewis, \$400 in 5303 funds and \$100 in RVMPO dues funds were approved to support the Livability Solutions Forum. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

7. RVMPO Planning Update

- Staff is working on the 2017 RTP update. Presentations will be made in the coming months.
- Staff continues to work on Title 6 Environmental Justice.
- Copies of the OMPOC General Work Scope were handed out to the Committee members. Comments to Staff from Committee members are welcomed.

- OMPOC will meet Nov. 6th, in Portland.
- The airport has been dong well, despite the smoke in the air.

The Policy Committee is being asked to consider approval of the following amendments to the 2013-2018 Regional Transportation Plan and 2015-2018 Transportation Improvement Program.

The 21-day public comment period and public hearing were advertised on September 1 in the Medford Tribune, and information has been available on the RVMPO website since that date. The RVMPO TAC has recommended approval of the amendments listed. Information on the projects is listed, below:

A. Add New Project to RTP & TIP: OR99: Ashland Creek Bridge Rehabilitation (KN19656)

Description: The Oregon 99 Southbound Ashland Creek Bridge has been deemed Structurally Deficient due to the "Poor" ratings for both the superstructure and substructure. This project will address the deterioration in the concrete that is causing this bridge to be Structurally Deficient and the undermining at both abutments.

B. Add New Project to RTP & TIP: I-5 Cable Barrier – Southern Oregon (KN19659)

Description: Lane departure and crossover crashes have been increasing on Interstate 5. Region 3 has numerous sections of I-5 with open medians. This project will address 16 open barrier segments between I-5 MP 30.8 and 153.50. The majority of these segments include widths of less than 100 feet between NB and SB lanes. Failure to provide barriers in these 16 segments increases the risk of lane departures and crossover crashes.
