3. 2018–2021 RVMPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendments 32:17–44:38

40:58 | Mike Kuntz moved to recommend to the Policy Committee approval of the 2018–2021 STIP Rebalance Amendments while requesting that MPO staff provide further details on the projects/funds to the Policy Committee as well as to the TAC—electronically. Seconded by Ian Horlacher.

42:30 | Paige West: Are these funds being transferred to other projects in Region 3 or are they being transferred to other projects outside of Region 3 in the State?

42:49 | Dan Roberts: Everything we rebalanced stayed within our region, some split across districts, but the funds stayed within the Region.

The TAC requested complete verification that ODOT's STIP rebalance kept all funds within the region.

4. Letter of Support for the City of Central Point's Urban Reserve Area (URA) CP-2B 44:39–01:07:56

53:39 | Josh LeBombard moved to recommend to the Policy Committee the approval of the letter of support for Central Point's URA with language additions in regards to Performance Indicator 2.6, which speaks more precisely to meeting the benchmark targets from the RTP regarding the number of dwelling units and employment to take place in mixed-use pedestrian friendly areas. Seconded by Alex Georgevitch.

Further discussion ensued about proximity of transit routes/stops to the proposed URA, CP-2B.

Charles Bennett, representing Jackson County Planning, abstained.

- 24:51 | K. Welzenbach: Should there be a policy from the MPO that even if a project will be fund exchanged or not, that the projects move forward as applied for?
- 27:53 | A. Georgevitch: If someone comes in and says we are going to put in very specific facilities and that convinces us to vote for it, there's an expectation that those facilities are going to be built. What if the one-line project description in the ODOT IGA doesn't include that detail.
- 28:17 | Mike Kuntz: Can we work with ODOT to say if the MPO approves a project description that that description is to be used in the IGA?
- TAC members agreed that further discussion on the above issue was needed and it should be brought back as a formal agenda item next month.

Policy Regarding Continuation of MPO funded Projects from Application to Completion:

Project Description/Completion: All projects approved and funded by the MPO Policy Committee must be completed in the manner that was described in the project application as submitted to the Policy Committee.

Project Substitution: The Rogue Valley MPO Policy Committee allows for substitutions of projects by member local governments, if recommended by the TAC and approved by the Policy Committee. These substitutions are allowed to accommodate unforeseen circumstances or situations that were either not known at the time of the project application or the policy of the local jurisdiction has changed so as to make the project unnecessary or unwanted. Should a substitution be deemed necessary by the affected local jurisdiction and approved by the Policy Committee, the MPO shall undertake a TIP and, if necessary, a RTP amendment to accommodate the project changes. All substituted projects shall be analyzed utilizing the project selection criteria methodology that was used at the time of the call for projects. It is the adopted policy of the RVMPO that only one substitution is allowed per jurisdiction per funding cycle. Should other events occur that dramatically delays a project or makes it unfeasible to construct the project, then the programmed monies will be reprogrammed through the competitive MPO Application Process.
