SUBJECT:	Reallocation of Discretionary STBG Funds – Ashland

The Policy Committee is being asked to consider approval of the following reallocation of discretionary STBG funds awarded to Ashland through the RVMPO. Below is a breakdown of the original funds awarded, the reallocation of the funds and the funds being returned to the MPO.

The RVMPO TAC has recommend approval to the Policy Committee to move funding from the Nevada Street to the Washington Street project with the following conditions: 1) the IAMP recommendation regarding the median extension to prevent left outs must be part of the completion of the project, and 2) an additional \$30,000 over the funding amount stated in the revised application should be approved.

The RVMPO PAC has recommend approval to the RVMPO Policy Committee of the Washington Street Extension to Tolman Creek Road as the proposed project substitution for the Nevada Street Bridge.
