SUBJECT:	FY 2024-25 RVMPO Dues Recommendation

This memo addresses the setting of RVMPO member dues. Staff is seeking a recommendation on the dues for the coming year.

RVMPO Member Dues

Staff proposes maintaining the dues formula and rate that was approved by the Policy Committee in February of 2013. The rate, \$0.16 per capita, would generate a total of \$30,881 for the 2024-25 fiscal year.

Table 1, below, summarizes population and proposed dues for each jurisdiction. Population estimates are from the December 15. 2023 estimates from Portland State University.

RVCOG staff utilized Portland State University population estimates of 2023 for cities populations.

*For unincorporated areas population estimates are derived from Southern Oregon ABM Model data which uses PSU certified estimates.

Dues provide funding for general operations, primarily activities that require local funds including lobbying and local match obligations. Dues pay for Policy Committee participation in advocacy activities for which federal funds cannot be used, including the Oregon MPO Consortium, the Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations and the West Coast Corridor Coalition. Dues can also be used to supplement the MPO's planning budget.

SUBJECT:	FY 2024-25 RVMPO Dues Numbers Explanation

This memo addresses the confusing in regard to the population numbers / trends within the local jurisdictions that were used in the FY 2024-2025 Dues.

Staff usually uses most recent and available certified numbers from <u>Portland State University</u> (PSU) to calculate the dues. Please note that PSU release revised numbers of past year estimates and those numbers are not the same as the certified numbers of that year.

The current year dues, FY 23-24, uses the <u>2022 Certified Population Estimates</u>. For FY 2024-2025 the <u>2023</u> <u>Certified Population Estimates</u> was used to calculate the dues. Note that within the 2023 certified Population Estimates there is a column shows the revised 2022 population estimates numbers and those numbers are not the same as the 2022 certified population estimates that were used in the current fiscal year dues, see table 1.

Population estimates are prepared as of July 1st of each year.

Certified estimates are posted on December 15th.

Table 1 showcase the difference between the 2022 certified numbers and the revised number and the percentage change for both numbers. When using the 2022 certified numbers and calculate the change with the 2023 certified numbers that gives us a negative trend in population. And the opposite is true when using the revised numbers. And that is why draft dues for FY 24-25 reflect the negative trend because it is using the 2022 certified numbers and not the revised numbers.

*Note: STBG typically increases each year. For the 2024-27 TIP STBG funds increase from \$2,689,293 in 2024 to \$2,735,710 in 2027. **Note: the gas tax allocation does not increase year over year.
