This memo addresses the setting of RVMPO member dues. Staff is seeking a recommendation on the dues for the coming year.

RVMPO Member Dues

Staff proposes maintaining the dues formula and rate that was approved by the Policy Committee in February of 2013. The rate, \$0.16 per capita, would generate a total of \$30,881 for the 2024-25 fiscal year.

Table 1, below, summarizes population and proposed dues for each jurisdiction. Population estimates are from the December 15. 2023 estimates from Portland State University.

Dues provide funding for general operations, primarily activities that require local funds including lobbying and local match obligations. Dues pay for Policy Committee participation in advocacy activities for which federal funds cannot be used, including the Oregon MPO Consortium, the Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations and the West Coast Corridor Coalition. Dues can also be used to supplement the MPO's planning budget.

I am writing on behalf of the Rogue Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization (RVMPO) to extend strong support for the Rogue Valley Transportation District's (RVTD) applications to the ODOT 2024-2026 discretionary grant programs. RVTD will use funding to acquire 3 replacement ADA vans for their Valley Lift service, to complete a mid-life rehabilitation of their CNG compressors and to fund planning services to begin phase II of their Campus Master Plan.

RVTD provides safe, reliable transit service for nearly 200,000 residents throughout southern Oregon's Rogue Valley, including the cities of Medford, Ashland, Central Point, Talent, Phoenix, White City, Eagle Point and Jacksonville. Through its service, RVTD aims to provide a viable, quality public transportation option that improves quality of life in the Rogue Valley by reducing traffic, boosting business, and allowing individuals to access jobs, school, and health care.

RVTD will use ODOT STBG grant funding to acquire three ADA vans for their Valley Lift paratransit service. The three vans will replace vans that have reached their useful life in 2024. RVTD will use ODOT 5339 funds to replace two CNG compressors, a CNG master control center and related infrastructure improvements. This mid-life rehabilitation of the CNG compressors is urgent due to one compressor experiencing catastrophic failure in December 2023 putting RVTD is a vulnerable position to fuel its fleet of 34 CNG buses. RVTD will use 5304 planning funds to begin Phase II of their Campus Master Plan consisting of future bus staging and parking and identifying locations for zero emission bus charging to support a ZEB transition in 2027.

Investment in these projects would support the vital service RVTD provides to the cities within the RVMPO. I respectfully ask for your support for this request and assistance in securing the benefits it will bring to the community. RVMPO Policy Regarding Awards of Discretionary Federal Transportation Funds

(Surface Transportation Program and Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Program)

This Policy addresses the allocation of STP and CMAQ funds awarded to the RVMPO planning area for surface transportation improvements. Projects receive federal funding through the RVMPO by way of listing in the current RVMPO Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program. Final approval for grant recipients is made by Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration through the funding obligation process, which occurs subsequent to publication in the MTIP.

- 1. RVMPO Policy Committee makes all final planning and programming decisions regarding STP and CMAQ program awards.
- 2. All awards are specific to a project and must be spent on that project.
- 3. Funds that are not used on the project for which they were allocated will be addressed as follows:
 - a. RVMPO member jurisdictions
 - i. When RVMPO grant funds are not fully expended, unused funds go back to the RVMPO region for re-allocation.
 - When a jurisdiction determines it will not implement a project, it may offer a substitute project(s). Both the currently programmed and its substitute project(s) will be evaluated according to current RVMPO evaluation process. The Policy Committee will consider the evaluation of the substitute project, particularly its performance relative to the original project, and other information the committee agrees is appropriate. The Policy Committee will decide whether:
 - 1. Funds should be awarded to the substitute project; or
 - 2. Funds should go back to the region for re-allocation.
 - iii. When a project cannot be implemented for reasons beyond the recipient jurisdiction's control (generally but not limited to when Federal Highway Administration or Federal Transit Administration finds an awarded project in-eligible) recipient jurisdiction will have 90 days from the date of final determination to submit a substitute project for consideration. Both the currently programmed and its substitute project will be scored according to current RVMPO evaluation process. The Policy Committee will consider evaluation of substitute project, particularly its performance relative to the original project, and other information the committee agrees is appropriate. The Policy

Committee will decide whether:

- 1. Funds should be awarded to the substitute project; or
- 2. Funds should go back to the region for re-allocation.
- b. Recipients that are not RVMPO members
 - i. All funds not used as described at the time of the award will go back to the RVMPO region for re-allocation.
- 4. Priority for available funds will be given to funded projects that need additional funding for completion.
- 5. Should funding still be available and if all programmed projects have been fully funded then prioritization may be given to those projects that were submitted through the application process but were not selected for funding.
