## **Article IV**

### **Meetings**

#### **Section 1. Regular Meetings**

- a. The Council shall hold its regular meeting on the third Tuesday of each month. No meeting shall be held during the month of December.

#### **Section 2. Special Meetings**

- b. Special meetings may be called by RVMPO's Planning Program Manager's designated staff on seven (7) days notice.
- c. The person calling such special meeting shall fix the time and place for holding of such meeting.

#### **Section 3. Conduct of Meetings**

- a. Official action may be taken by the Council when a quorum is present.
- b. A quorum shall exist when a majority of appointed members are present.
- c. The voting on all questions coming before the MPO Public Advisory Council shall be by voice vote and decided by a simple majority of members present. The ayes and nays shall be entered in the minutes of such meeting. If a motion on question fails, deliberation shall continue until a motion or definitive action is offered and passed.

## **Article V**

### **Officers and Duties**

#### **Section 1. Officers**

- a. The officers of the Council shall be a Chair and Vice-Chair to be elected by the Council at the first meeting of the calendar year.

#### **Section 2. Term of Office**

- a. The officers shall hold office for a period of one (1) year.

#### **Section 3. Duties of Officers**

- a. The Chair shall preside over the meeting.
- b. In the absence of the Chair, the Vice Chair shall perform all Chair duties.

#### Section 4. RVMPO Planning Program Manager

- a. The RVCOG's Planning Program Manager shall be an ex-officio, non-voting member of the Council. The program manager shall be responsible for staff support of the Council, including minute taking and record keeping.

### **Article VI**

#### **Amendments to Bylaws**

##### Section 1.

- a. These bylaws may be amended or repealed or new bylaws may be adopted by a supermajority vote of two thirds of the members of the Council present at any regular or special meeting called for that purpose. Written notice of proposed amendments shall be given to the membership of the Council at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the meeting at which the bylaws are to be considered. Any objections to the proposed amendments shall be forwarded to RVMPO's Planning Program Manager.
- b. Amendments to the bylaws shall become effective upon approval by the MPO Policy Committee.

**SUBJECT:** FY 2026-27 RVMPO Member Dues

Discussions at the January Public Advisory Council (PAC), Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and Policy Committee meetings, resulted in a preferred population estimation method to calculate member dues. Using this method, staff have updated the FY 2026-2027 member dues and are now seeking their approval.

Additionally, the RVMPO Policy Committee has directed staff to index membership dues to the Consumer Price Index or CPI and base future dues calculations on the CPI. The CPI is the index used to track changes in prices over time and show how inflation or purchasing power is evolving. For the 12 months ending in December, 2025, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) economic news release (<https://www.bls.gov/news.release/cpi.toc.htm>) reports the national All Items CPI (CPI) rose 2.7 percent.

Staff have updated the proposed membership dues below utilizing recent population estimates, as discussed, and the CPI. Table 1 reflects the previously approved 2025-26 RVMPO membership dues. Table 2 shows membership dues with updated population estimates, the 2.7% per capita dues rate increase and the increase or decrease in dues from the 2025-26 dues. Upon approval by the Policy Committee, future dues calculations will also be indexed to the previous year BLS All Items CPI.

*1. What experience, interest, knowledge or qualifications would you bring to the Public Advisory Council?*

I served on the RVMPO Policy Committee from 2013 until 2020 while representing the Ashland City Council. It was a fascinating experience and I learned a tremendous amount about regional transportation system/project planning. It took several years to fully grasp jargon-heavy, technical processes. Consequently, I would have a general understanding of how things work on Day 1 as a member of the PAC.

In addition to five elected terms on the Ashland Parks and Recreation Commission or the Ashland City Council, I also have 20 years of experience as a local government employee, including the past 10 years as the City of Medford's parks and recreation director. The planning and development aspect of the job often relates to multi-modal connectivity between parks and neighborhoods, including multiple greenways.

I am familiar with most of the transportation topics or issues involving Ashland, Medford, and the Rogue Valley generally having been a resident of Ashland from 1994 until 2023, and as an employee working in west Medford since 2006.
